

- Victorian Council Animal Control Benchmarking Exercise (UAM Adelaide 2004)
- "Line in the sand"
- Outcome produced valuable statistics
- Five key findings





- Low registration rates of dogs (64%) and cats (41%) across the State
- Lack of services for cats, mainly in Rural areas
- High incidents of dogs and cats wandering at large in our communities
- Major difficulties faced by Rural Councils in providing animal management services
- Low levels of training provided to Authorised Officers (25.22 hours annually)



Step 4: Documentation / Communication


Step 5: Performance Monitoring & Evaluation



DAM Plans require:

- Evaluating animal management services
- Training programs Authorised Officers
- Promote responsible pet ownership
- Improved compliance with the Act
- Minimise risk of attacks by dogs
- Address overpopulation and high euthanasia rates
- Encourage registration and identification








DAM Plans require:

- Minimise dogs and cats creating a nuisance
- Identify declared dogs and ensure compliance
- Review existing Orders and Local Laws

Every Council must:

- Review DAM Plan annually
- Provide a copy to DPI Secretary



Publish evaluation DAM Plan implementation



- Formalised process
- Community consultation
- Community awareness
- Management awareness
- Management support
- Address training needs
- Improved animal management
- Improved animal welfare





- Domestic (Feral and Nuisance) Animal Act 1994
- Bureau of Animal Welfare support Councils
- Established a DAM Plan working group
- Development of DAM Plan Manual & Template
 - minimum standard
 - best practice
- Hard copy and electronically available
- Road show workshops (Metro and regional)
