Accredited vs Non-accredited Training


What is the difference?


Accredited training usually comes from a National Training Package and can only be delivered by an RTO approved to run the course. There are rules and guidelines about how these courses can be delivered and assessed

Non-accredited training does not comply with any rules and can be delivered by anyone, RTO or not












Standards for RTOs 2015



Standards for RTOs 2015

Standard 3.5 The RTO accepts and provides credit to learners for units of competency and/or modules (unless licensing or regulatory requirements prevent this) where these are evidenced by:

- a) AQF certification documentation issued by <u>any other</u> RTO or AQF authorised issuing organisation; or
- b) authenticated VET transcripts issued by the Registrar.
