


## Challenges

- 186,000 km2
- 2 staff
- 1 pound 600 kms from HQ
- 12 communities, some cut off in wet season
- Cross cultural environment with very different histories



- No by laws
- No dangerous dog legislation
- > 2000 free roaming dogs
- Value on hunting or guard dogs
- Little to no fencing
- Highest rates of dogs bites and hospitalisation per capita
